Additional Information / Reasons for Decision

Report from post chief of contact in lap 2. Reviewed in car footage of both 32 and 12, and spoke to drivers. Both gave the opinion that car 4 had made contact into rear of 12 forcing 12 into 32. Eventually able to review footage from car 4 and could see at least a car length behind 12. However, could then also see a puff of smoke from rear left of car 12 suggested only one rear brake locked. Driver said they are investigating. Therefore, after extensive investigation, no further action deemed necessary.
