Following investigations I find that you are guilty of contravening Motorsport UK regulation C1.1.6, namely:

Q.12.24.3 (f) Double Flashing/Waved Yellow - overtaking or not slowing down between signal and incident (Q12.24.5)

Additional Information / Reasons for Decision:

Viewed in car footage and interviewed driver. He said he simply didn't see the signal.

Accordingly under Motorsport UK Regulation G5.3.2, I order that you:

- List of penalty options with checkboxes and point values: Be given a verbal warning [0 points], Have the following lap times disallowed [0 points], Be given this formal written reprimand [2 points], Be fined the sum of (Max £1,150) [3 points], Be given a place grid penalty effective on your next race [3 points], Be given a drive through penalty [0 points], Be given a Stop / Go penalty [0 points], Converted in to a post race time penalty of [0 points], Be penalised by the addition of to your elapsed race time [3 points], Be penalised by the addition of position(s) to your race finishing position [3 points], Be disqualified from practice and your practice times are disallowed* [4 points], Be disqualified from the results of the race [4 points], Be disqualified from the results of the meeting [6 points], Additional Championship Penalty:

4 Penalty points are recorded on your licence as a result of above (C2.1.5, C2.1.7)

* If your practice times are dis-allowed above, you may, in accordance with Q12.9.4., start the race from the back of the grid with a mandatory 10 second delay or start from the pitlane on the first racing lap.

You are advised of your right of appeal.
