BRITISH ENDURANCE CHAMPIONSHIP

BLOCKBUSTER BEC BLASTS BACK INTO LIFE AT SILVERSTONE

The British Endurance Championship in association with Motorsport UK hits the halfway point in the season this Saturday and after a two-month break, the battle for supremacy is set to heat up.

Taking to the legendary Grand Prix circuit with renewed vigour will be current table-toppers Peter Erceg and Marcus Clutton in the PB Racing Audi GT3, defending, thanks to the innovative class points-distribution formula, their five-point series lead.

Sitting second currently is the Class D Xentek Porsche of Bal Sidhu and Josh Steed, while third in the standings is the MacG Racing Ginetta G55 of Jonny MacGregor and "French Texan" Arthur Simondet.

All will have class pressure, though, as former champion Witt Gamski joins the fray in Class A, partnered by Michael Lyons in the long-awaited MJC Bentley Continental GT3, while in Class D, the Track Focused KTM X-Bow of Mike McCollum/Sean Cooper returns.

They'll face new arrivals Neil Wallace and Ian Astley's SVG BMW M4, and Team BRIT's regular McLaren 570s for Aaron Morgan/Paul Fullick is boosted by new team mates Bobby Trundley and Charles Graham in a similar machine.

A further McLaren 570s is entered for single-seater ace Jay Bridger and Chun Cheong-ip. Class B front runners Nick Hull and Richard Avery will need to keep a keen eye on the lap chart and timing screens to score well in their Porsche 992, as will brothers Callum and Adam Thompson in the rejuvenated Class F Newbarn Racing Jaguar F-Type.

Over in Class E, points leaders Chris Bialan and Simon Mason have competition for their Jabbasport Cupra Leon from newbies Peter Spano and Andrew Bentley's similar Ramen Racing machine, and yet another JW Bird Cupra for Matthew Wilson.



This upcoming weekend gives the 2024 grid its first taste of racing on a current F1 circuit as the ROKiT British F4 Championship certified by the FIA makes its return to the 3.66 mile Silverstone Grand Prix circuit for the fifth round of the 2024 season.

The Silverstone GP circuit is epitomised with a combination of both high-speed and slower, technical corners complemented with the Hamilton, National and Wellington straights serving up plenty of driver challenges and overtaking opportunities for British F4's class of 2024, who will be are following in the footsteps of the many racing icons who have battled on the iconic Northamptonshire track.

All this action will be visible for armchair ROKiT British F4 fans worldwide who can enjoy each of the races broadcast live on the event's BARC Live Stream broadcast and on British F4's YouTube channel.

Off the back of a thrilling weekend of racing at Thruxton, the championship heads into the second event of a double header.

Last weekend saw two new faces on the top step of the podium. Alex Berg (Fortec Motorsport) and Reza Seewooruthun (Hitch Pulse-Eight) each collected their first wins in the ROKIT British F4 championship, making the drivers the sixth and seventh race winners of the season.

Championship leader Deagen Fairclough (Hitch Pulse-Eight) also collected a win last time out, adding a fourth win to his tally, however, a retirement while in the lead of Race 3 has allowed Rodin Motorsport's Alex Ninovic to close the gap to Fairclough in the championship fight to 30 points. Rodin Motorsport's James Higgins, Jack Sherwood and Abbi Pulling make up the remaining top five positions in the points standings.

Phinsys by Argenti's Yuanpu Cui and Rowan Campbell-Pilling continue to sit first and second in the Rookie Cup, with Campbell-Pilling closing the gap to 16 points between the teammates after two visits to the rookie podium at Thruxton. Virtuosi Racing's Martin Molnar has moved into third.

Rodin Motorsport remains at the top of the Teams' Cup standings ahead of Hitech Pulse-Eight with Phinsys by Argenti in third.



BRITCAR TROPHY CHAMPIONSHIP

ALL TO PLAY FOR AND NOTHING TO LOSE IN BRITCAR TROPHY

The points table in the shows that there is no clear-cut domination in the Britcar Trophy Championship so far this season, with the Clio and Class 2 runners sharing the top three spots in the overall standings.

Overall wins have been shared by four of the Class 1 contingent - the Datum Motorsport Ginettas of Maurizio Sciglio, Marco Anastasi and Axel van Nederveen, as well as the Cupra of Chris Bialan and Simon Mason.

Sometimes they are infiltrated by the BMWs of Lee Goldsmith and Jas Sapra/Bryan Bransom, while we're yet to see the best of the Hyundai Veloster of Lewis Kent and Charlie Kennedy.

Consistency has placed the TSR Audi TT of Mark Jones and Rob Ellick second in the overall standings, and they have shared Class 2 victories with the Team BRIT BMW M240i, brimful of talent with Asha Silva and Noah Cosby.

However if Nigel Greensall shares David Gooding's Geof Steel-run BMW E36, things might go differently. Novices Caleb McDuff and Dom Shore are steadily improving in the Team BRIT BMW 1-series, and head Class 3, though they have a contingent of SVG Ginetta G40s to contend with

The Clio Class is where the close action is, with four regulars making nose-to-tail and side-by-side action the norm. Maurice Henry and Hadley Simpson are championship leaders for High Row Motorsport, with the Dragon Sport machine of team boss Rhys Lloyd and Academy graduate Harri Reynolds trailing by nine points.

That could change in the drop of hat, with stablemates Travis Coyne/Alex Nevill (Dragon Sport) and Sam Neser/Jack James (High Row) vying for the lead too, while James Harrison, partnered by Ben Jenkins or John Cooper is in the mix as well. Andreas Georgiou and Travis Chapman have had a troubled start to the season, and will be seeking to improve.

CATERHAM ACADEMY

ALL-ACTION CATERHAM ACADEMY HEADS TO SILVERSTONE

The Caterham Academy is Europe's most successful novice driver racing series and so far it has made the dream of becoming a racing driver come true for more than 1,300 racing people since 1995.

Overall, the Academy package consists of a Caterham Academy race car, a full season of competition, and the ever present support of Caterham's motorsport organisation; while a ladder of championships above it provides plenty of added motivation.

With the championship typically attracting more than fifty drivers each year, the series is split into two parallel grids; Green and White, however due to the length of the circuit both groups are set to amalgamate together this weekend.

In the Green group, Bruno van Dyke has hit the ground running to assume the early lead in the points although his advantage sits at a slender six points with Alexander Coombes and James Hall firmly within striking distance.

Brian Thornton, Ben Snape, Oliver White and Dean Burden are just some of the names to look out for them as they look to close the gap to the top three.

Switching across to the White group, things are equally as tight during these early rounds with Paul Oggelsby leading Cal Short and Scott Helme by just four points.

The Mission Motorsport
Caterham Seven 270R

of the one-make series is
proving to be no different.

Billed as being the next step up from the Roadsport category, the 270R series sees improvements made to the car's suspension, while there is also the removal of the screen and lights as well as professional team support being permitted.

As the third rung on the Caterham Motorsport ladder, the category has always lined bright and on the evidence of the opening few races a tantalising title battle lies in prospect.

Before anyone can start to think about contending for the crown there is the small matter of three races around Silverstone's legendary Grand Prix circuit; and that

also means assessing who could take on a starring role in Northamptonshire.

Ryan Wilby arrives at the Home of British Motor Racing sitting at the helm of the standings although his three-point cushion of David Rooke means that there is no time for resting on his laurels.

Behind them is the quintet of Toby Ballard, Daniel Hope, Lyonel Tollemache, Rrutuj Patki and Rob Kennerley who are blanketed by just two points as it stands.

Further down the order, other names to look out for include Daniel Neale and the two Craig's - Boyle and Storey respectively. Harvey Lawrence will look to break into the top ten this weekend, as will the likes of Nick Bryant, Steve Merritt, Ben Timmons and and Toby Boyes.

The Caterham Seven 270R Championship is stacked with talent and in-truth, one page doesn't do it justice as to how wide open this weekend's battle for supremacy could well be. It is going to be fascinating to watch!

CATERHAM 310R CHAMPIONSHIP

COOKING UP A STORM

Silverstone has played host to all manner of ultra-competitive battles down the years and there is every expectation that another will be served up this weekend in the Motul Caterham Seven 310R Championship.

Providing the perfect proving ground for those drivers that one day want to progress to the Seven UK Championship, the 310R category has become a must-see attraction on the Caterham Motorsport ladder and this year it boasts another stacked line-up.

After two pulsating events at Snetterton and Zandvoort, the fight at the top of the standings has seen Harry Cook, Hugo Bush and Lars Hoffman establish themselves as the early pace-setters - and none of them are showing any signs of letting their foot off the gas.

Heading to the Home of British Motor Racing, Cook holds a slender four-point advantage over Bush, while Hoffman is a further point adrift. Now all three have stood on top step of the podium this year so be sure to keep an eye out for them as they're guaranteed to be in the mix. Leading the chase for the top three are a host of comparable contenders including Philip Bianchi, Ben Lopez-Appleton, Tom Wyllys and Duncan Mallet - all of whom have enjoyed fine starts to their own individual campaigns.

Another driver to look out for is David Yates, whilst Taylor O'Flanagan and last year's 270R Championship title winner Freddie Chiddicks have cemented themselves as drivers that can fight at the front on any given day.

Beyond the top ten, other drivers that will be looking to make their marks across the weekend's trio of races includes Graham Macdonald, Ryan Lovett, Harry Eyre, Geoff Price, Marc Jones, Stephen Metcalfe and William Wood - to name just a few.

One of the biggest grids to take to the world-famous Silverstone Grand Prix circuit this weekend is likely to be in the Bilstein Caterham Roadsport Championship, which has been an unmissable spectacle so far this season.

Offering the next step on the Caterham Motorsport ladder for drivers progressing up from the Academy, the Roadsport category has established itself as the ultimate proving ground for second-year racers.

The 2024 campaign has been one packed with attrition so far with entry lists exceeding 40 cars at times - an impressive statistic for any championship in the world at the moment and further proof of Caterham's commitment to pushing talent forward.

Following blockbuster rounds at Snetterton and Zandvoort, Jonathan Emery descends on Northamptonshire in the pound seat

having climbed to the top of the standings to hold a six-point advantage over his nearest rival.

Emery was one of the standout performers in the Academy last year and he's wasted no time in finding his groove in the Roadsport category, having powered his machine to a number of race wins already.

Paul Goldstein is the lead hunter for Emery and he - along with Henry Morris, Istvan Demes, Monty Hide and Ben Steward - will be eager to close the gap on what could be a pivotal weekend in the fight for overall honours.

Adam Kene, Jack English, Paddy Cunningham and Olly Brown occupy the remaining spots inside the top ten and whilst they will be keen to work their way up the order, they'll also have to be wary of those nipping at their heels.

Tim Payne, Django Jones, Will Jarvis, Barry Hanif, Neil Bell, Harvey Ashmore and Lee James are just a handful of drivers that are a couple of points away from breaking into the top ten.

BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close.

(Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(**Double Waved**) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit



YELLOW/RED STRIPES Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.



BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.
