

# Bike Supplementary Regulations

## Event classification

ACU Permit Number: 203097 EMN: 10/1858	Course Licence: 020HC
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The British Automobile Racing Club Limited (Motorcycle division) will organise PR5 and PR6 motorcycle parades at Goodwood Hillclimb, Goodwood Park, Goodwood, Chichester, West Sussex PO18 0PX from Thursday 11th July 2024 to Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> July 2024 inclusive. The Promoter is the Goodwood Road Racing Company Limited. The event will be known as the Goodwood Festival of Speed (Hillclimb).

The event will be held under the National Sporting Code of the ACU and the Hill Climb and Road Race Standing Regulations. Final Instructions for the event will be issued with each participant's ticket pack, approximately three weeks before the event.

## **PR5 Parade**

A PR5 parade is for road going motorcycles.

### **PR5 Rider Eligibility**

Riders under 70 years of age must hold a current ACU Road Race Competition Licence, or a current ACU Road Race Parade Licence or a Full Class "A" DVLA motorcycle licence.

Participants (including sidecar passengers) who are 70 years of age or over must hold a current ACU Parade Licence or a current ACU Road Race Competition Licence.

First time applicants for an ACU Road Race Parade Licence must hold a current Full Class "A" DVLA motorcycle licence or must satisfactorily complete an ACU Road Race Basic Rider Assessment.

The minimum age for participation in Parades is 14 years. Where a participant is under the age of 18 years a Parental Consent Form must also be completed.

All participants must complete an Entry Form Declaration using the standard ACU wording for participation in Road Racing.

Riders must be members of an ACU affiliated club.

**Documents.** DVLA motorcycle licence and/or ACU licence applicable to that rider must be produced at signing-on.

### **Insurance**

No Personal Accident insurance is included in respect of PR5 parades.

No cover is included in respect of machines, clothing or other personal property etc

**Clothing** Full leather clothing (one piece or two piece zipped together) in good condition or suitable protective motorcycle clothing, including boots and gloves, designed for road use must be worn

**Safety Helmets** Safety helmets must be worn and fastened properly at all times and must be legal for road use. ACU Gold standard is recommended.

## **PR6 Parade**

A PR6 Parade is an opportunity for "Past Master" class riders to participate to celebrate past performances and/or riders of Classic machines or Machines of Historical Interest to participate for their own pleasure in controlled circumstances.

### **PR6 Rider Eligibility**

Riders under 70 years of age must hold a current ACU Road Race Competition Licence, or a current ACU Road Race Parade Licence or a Full Class "A" DVLA motorcycle Licence.

Participants (including sidecar passengers) who are 70 or over must hold an ACU Parade Licence or a current ACU Road Race Competition Licence.

First time applicants for an ACU Road Race Parade Licence must hold a current Full Class "A" DVLA motorcycle licence or must satisfactorily complete an ACU Road Race Basic Rider Assessment.

Riders must be members of an ACU affiliated club.

The event is open to riders between the ages of 14 and 70. Riders under the age of 18 years must complete an ACU Parental Consent form. The parent or legal

guardian must attend sign-on with them and be present for the duration of the event.

Riders with a licence issued by a Federation other than the ACU/SACU must have a Start Permission from their own federation together with confirmation that they have Medical and Repatriation insurance in accordance with the FIM requirements.

## **Clothing**

All riders must wear a complete all in one leather suit of at least 1.2mm thick on all parts of the suit, suitable gloves and boots. Two-piece garments zipped together are allowed, the suit must zip together over at least 75% of the waistband.

## **Safety Helmets**

Helmets must be worn as specifically approved for the sport and must display an ACU Gold sticker. Overseas riders may use helmets approved by their own FMN.

## **Insurance**

Insurance cover is included as follows:

The Insurance Company (Brokers) will be appointed by the ACU.

Personal Accident benefits are included for those taking part in PR6 Parades and is limited to £10,000 Death, and £20,000 Loss of or loss of use of two limbs or the sight of two eyes, or loss of use of one limb and one eye, the loss of or loss of use of a limb or the sight of an eye. There are no weekly benefits in respect of temporary or total disablement.

Should any participants be found to be in breach of these Standing Regulations for Parades the Insurance arrangements stated in this article will be null and void.

The Insurance is for personal accident only and does not cover machine, clothing, equipment etc.

The Secretary of the Parade is responsible for the payment of Personal Accident Insurance premiums, which must be submitted to the Secretary of the meeting on the day of the parade at the latest. The Secretary of the Meeting is then responsible for the payment of the Insurance Premiums to the Brokers.

No cover is included in respect of machines, clothing or other personal property etc.

The Club (or organiser) undertakes to insure each driver and passenger, indemnifying him against any third party claims made arising out of the official PR6 Parade, excluding claims made by other drivers or passengers, entrant, sponsor or mechanic.

## **Information for PR5 & PR6 Participants**

### **Conditions of entry**

The entry list opens upon publication of these regulations and closes 17:00hrs on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> June 2024. The maximum number of entries is 70 motorcycles and minimum 20 motorcycles. Entry is by invitation only. Final selection of entries is at the sole discretion of the promoter.

### **Riders' Sign-on**

All riders must sign on before making their first run. The sign-on desk is situated in the Drivers' Club and is open from 12:00hrs – 18:00hrs on Wednesday, then from 07:30hrs – 17:30hrs Thursday – Sunday.

### **Machine Technical Requirements**

All motorcycles must comply with ACU safety regulations. The organising promoter reserves the right to refuse or revoke an entry at any time if the motorcycle is not prepared or presented in the appropriate manner.

### **Technical Inspection**

All machines and the riders' leathers etc, must have been passed by the Technical Officer before the machine/rider is allowed to participate. Technical inspection begins on Wednesday at 14:00hrs and continues Friday from 08:00hrs.

### **Rider's Briefing**

There is no specific briefing for this event. However, written briefing notes will be issued when you sign-on, which all are obliged to read prior to their first run. Failure to comply with the instructions or the briefing notes may result in disqualification from subsequent sessions.

### **The Course**

The asphalt hillclimb course is 1.16 miles (1.86km) and climbs by 300ft (92m) to the finish.

### **Parade Event Conduct**

A Pr5 & PR6 parades will not have any competitive element under any circumstances. The riding standard of parade riders, drivers and passengers, including speed, will be closely monitored and any rider deemed to be riding in an inappropriate manner disqualified.

### **Parade Organisation**

The speed of the Parades: Will be determined by the Clerk of the Course who will take into consideration the circuit, conditions and machinery.

The Clerk of the Course will immediately disqualify any rider deemed to be riding in an inappropriate manner by means of a Black Flag displayed at the Start and Finish line together with a board bearing the rider's number.

Riders who fall from their machine are not permitted to continue with the parade or participate in any further parades at the same meeting until passed fit by the Medical Officer and the machine re-inspected by technical control.

## **Flag Signals**

If a red flag is displayed on the hill, you must stop and await instructions. You may proceed slowly as directed by the marshals.

## **Method of Start for Parade Events**

The parade events will start with paraders allowed onto the hill in single file.

## **Passengers**

In accordance with ACU regulations, no machine is allowed to carry a passenger on the hillclimb unless specific approval for that machine has been granted by the ACU. Permission to carry a passenger is normally granted ONLY to motorcycle/sidecar combinations. All sidecar passengers must complete and sign a separate entry form and sign on accordingly.

## **Programme of the Meeting**

The event begins on Thursday for road and competition bikes. Road bikes will be given two runs per day from Thursday through to Sunday with competition bikes participating in one run on the Hill on Thursday and two runs on from Friday to Sunday. The organisers reserve the right to amend or cancel the programme in part or full without prior notice.
